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# **Call for Papers**

The 2<sup>nd</sup> ICRU International Conference on World Sustainable Development (WSD 2020) "Sustainable Community Development" Hosted by 6 Rajabhat Universities and Their Overseas University Networks February 17-19, 2020

At Nakhon Si Thammarat Rajabhat University

The world is facing three dimensional challenges in sustainable development: economic, social, and environmental. Over a billion people are still living in extreme poverty, and the income inequality within and among many countries has been on the rise. Simultaneously, unsustainable consumption and production patterns have resulted in huge economic and social costs and may endanger lives on the planet. Achieving sustainable development will require global actions with legitimate aspiration to maneuver the economic and social progresses, control growth and employment, and strengthen environmental protection. Sustainable development will need to be inclusive so that the cooperation can provide special care for the poorest and most vulnerable. Strategies need to be ambitious, action-oriented, collaborative, and adaptive to different levels of development. They will need to systemically transform consumption and production patterns which might entail, inter alia, significant price corrections, encourage the preservation of natural endowments, reduce inequality, and strengthen economic governance.

In 2015, over 190 world leaders committed to the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to help us all to end extreme poverty, fight inequality and injustice and fix climate change. We each have a role to play to achieve these goals which are towards a more prosperous, equitable, and sustainable world. By 2030, almost 60% of the world's population will live in urban areas and most of that urban expansion will be in the developing world. Rapid urbanization puts pressure on supplies of fresh water, sewage systems, living environment and public health. Let us embrace the technological and social benefits of cities by ensuring that they are safe for everyone and sustainable for decades to come. The 2<sup>nd</sup> ICRU International Conference on World Sustainable Development (WSD 2020) is initiated as a venue for academicians and researchers to express and share their findings, together with building relationships and networks with others, purposely to achieve the ultimate mutual goals of the United Nations' sustainable development.

The conference sessions will be organized into multiple concurrent session tracks under the Sustainable Development Themes.

#### PAPER SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Please follow the following guidelines to format your paper. It is imperative that all papers are submitted in a standardized format. Papers not adhering to them will be returned to the authors for a reformat.

#### All full papers must meet the following requirements:

- Inclusion of a 100-150 word abstract
- · Saved in a MSWord file format
- Times New Roman with the 11-point font size
- Inclusion of paper title with all authors, affiliations, and contact details
- Graphics and tables must be accessible by MSWord or MS Excel.

Please refer to the format example/template to review the requirements below:

#### Headings

As a minimum, all Full Research papers should include the following headings or sections:

#### For full 'empirical' papers include:

- · Abstract and Keywords
- Introduction
- Methods
- Results
- Discussion
- Conclusions and Implications
- References

# For full 'conceptual/theoretical' papers include:

- Abstract and Keywords
- Introduction
- · Conclusions and Implications
- References

# **EXAMPLE/TEMPLATE** TITLE OF YOUR PAPER

#### **ABSTRACT**

Place your abstract here. The short abstract should be composed of 100-150 words that briefly summarizes your paper. It should provide details rather than present intentions. Indent the abstract paragraph for 1.5 cm with a single space and justified text alignment. The abstract should be followed by a list of no more than six (6) keywords that define the subject matter.

# MAIN BODY

Begin your copy here as per the headings outlined previously. Use single space within each paragraph and double space between paragraphs. Do not number the pages and leave it to the editor, but ensure that the















content is in the correct page order. Please specify 3cm for the top, bottom, left, and right margins. The paper should be no more than 15 pages in the A4 size.

## **TABLES AND FIGURES**

Tables and figures must appear within the text and not at the end of the text. They should be numbered sequentially, e.g., Table 1, Table 2, Table 3, etc. Include a title for each (in upper- and lower-case letters), to explain the contents. For example:

Table 1: Profile of Typical Travel and Tourism Students

When appropriate, appendices should appear at the end of the article after the list of references.

#### REFERENCES

References must be listed immediately following the CONCLUSION AND IMPLICATIONS section of the paper. Use the APA style and alphabetize the list by author in chronological order. List the authors' names exactly as cited and use no abbreviations. See examples below:
